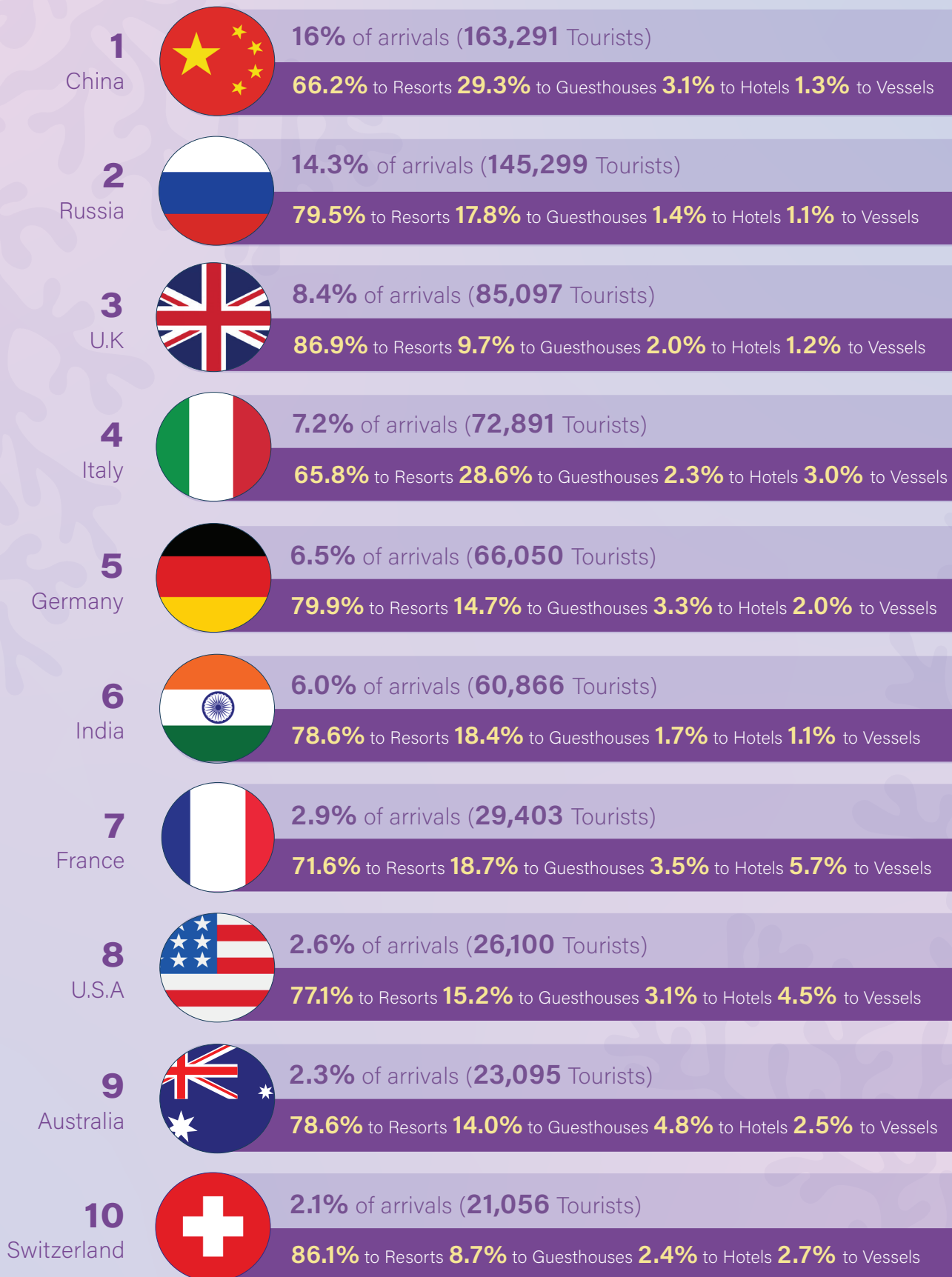

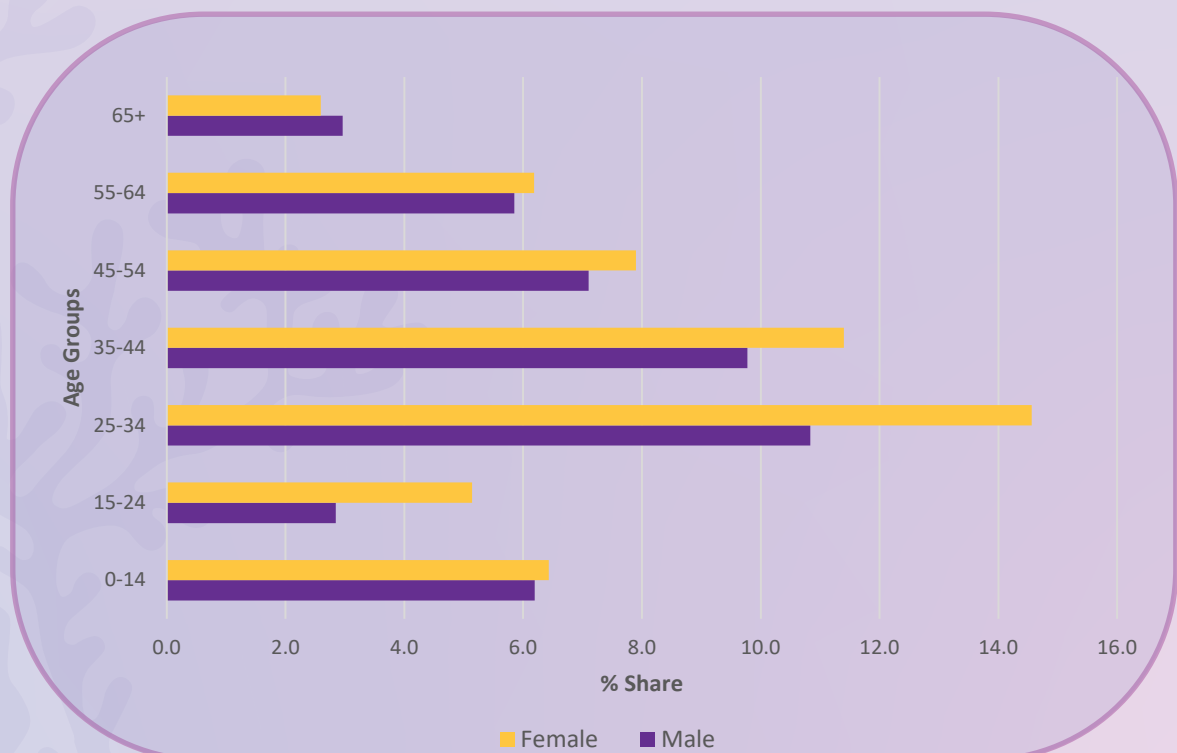

Maldives Welcomes its 1 Millionth Tourist of 2026



The Maldives has welcomed its one millionth tourist of 2026 within the same timeframe as last year, highlighting the resilience of the tourism industry despite ongoing global challenges.

The milestone was celebrated at Velana International Airport with a special ceremony organized by the Visit Maldives Corporation (VMC), Ministry of Tourism and Civil Aviation (MoTCA), Maldives Airports Company Limited (MACL), and Maldives Immigration.

The one millionth visitor, Ms. Almudena Ortuño Esparza from Spain, arrived on 21 June 2026 aboard Qatar Airways and was welcomed with a traditional cultural reception.

Speaking at the event, Minister of Tourism and Civil Aviation Hon. Mohamed Ameen stated that achieving the milestone despite disruptions to key air routes reflects the dedication of tourism stakeholders and the continued global appeal of the Maldives as a premier travel destination.

Speaking at the Leaders Dialogue on “Tourism, Resilience and International Action for a Sustainable Future” at the 21st Jeju Forum for Peace and Prosperity, State Minister Dr. Abdulla Niyaz, highlighted the urgent need for stronger international cooperation to support island destinations. Dr. Niyaz emphasised that international cooperation must deliver practical solutions for island destinations through accessible climate finance, guaranteed connectivity during crises, and dedicated financial support mechanisms for tourism-dependent economies that are highly vulnerable to geo political shocks.

Visit Maldives and Gold Medal launch major B2B joint campaign to capture booming UK luxury market



Visit Maldives Corporation (VMC) has launched a joint marketing campaign with leading UK tour operator Gold Medal, aimed at strengthening the Maldives' position as the ultimate luxury destination for British travelers. Signed on May 29, 2026, the high-impact campaign is currently live across the United Kingdom and will run through July 31, 2026. Through this partnership, VMC aims to establish an efficient, high-value B2B sales pipeline by securing direct access to specialist travel agents and retail networks across the UK.

The campaign comes at a time of remarkable growth for the destination. According to the latest Maldives Tourism Updates, the UK stands strong as the third largest source market for the Maldives this year, accounting for 80,881 arrivals and an impressive 8.7 percent of the total market share as of June 4, 2026. This strong demand for luxury, leisure, and experiential travel underscores the timeliness of the new initiative, which focuses heavily on the trade and retail sectors to convert interest into concrete bookings.

Visit Maldives together with MAYA Welcomes Chinese Cruise ship “Viking Yidun” as it makes its first visit to Maldives



Visit Maldives Corporation (VMC) together with the Maldives Association of Yacht Agents (MAYA) welcomed the Chinese cruise ship Viking Yidun, as it makes its first visit to Maldives, with a special reception held at Jetty 1, Male'. This marks the first arrival of a Chinese cruise vessel to the Maldives.

The arrival represents a step in the continued diversification of the Maldives' tourism portfolio and the development of cruise tourism as a complementary segment of the Maldives' wider tourism offering.
